



# **ROWING:** Teamwork at it's BEST...

How long have you been rowing and how did you get your start in it? I have been involved in rowing since the 8th grade where I did a middle school program as a rower but didn't officially start the high school program until I was a freshman in high school. When I started my freshman year I wanted to be a rower but my coach told me I was too short and was too tiny so she suggested I become a coxswain. I started because my brother who was two years older than me started rowing his freshman year of high school and had learned about it through a friend.

What position do you play? I am a coxswain and my responsibility is to steer the boat as well as be a "mini-coach." I am responsible for running practice as well as detecting issues regarding speed and technique in the boat and finding solutions to those problems and bringing everyone together to fix it.

What do you like best about your sport? I like that rowing is a team sport. In order to be successful in rowing, you can't do it by yourself. If everyone doesn't come together for one goal then everything can fall apart. This is what makes rowing so different but also so fun. It has also taught me life skills such as teamwork, communication, time management, commitment, and many other skills.















What's the most important quality to have as an athlete? The most important quality to have as an athlete is to have a growth mindset. In order to become better at whatever you do you have to believe that nothing is impossible and there is no such thing as "I can't."

Who is your role model/ Who do you look up to? My role model is an Olympic coxswain named Mary Whipple who coxed the Women's 8 to a gold medal in 2008 and 2012 and a silver medal in 2004. I also look up to Caroline Ricksen who is a year older than me currently coxing at Stanford University. She coxed the Women's 4+ (four people are in the boat and the + means there is also a coxswain) to a third-place finish at Junior Worlds last year and she inspires me every day to work a little harder to become a little better so that I can compete at that level next year.

Now that you're a senior, looking back what was the



best memory of high school? I wouldn't consider this a memory but definitely the best thing that has happened to me. I became super close with four other coxswains on my team last year and they have helped me to become the coxswain and person I am today. It isn't always common for coxswains to become best friends because we are competing against each other all the time but that just makes it so much more fun. Another good memory of high school was being selected to cox the CanAmMex (everyone selected for this boat is under 18 in the year 2018) and represent the USA in Mexico City, Mexico, this past summer.

What are your plans for college? I plan to attend the University of Washington to continue my academics and rowing in the fall of 2019.

What's your intended major to study? I am interested in studying environmental science and possibly environmental policy or marine biology.

Do you have any advice for someone thinking about trying crew? Don't give up when it gets hard! It is hard to learn how to do a sport such as rowing because not only is it physically hard as a rower but there is also so much mental thought behind it. Although it is hard, it is so rewarding. Suffering with your teammates through an entire race is so hard but the best part is winning at the end.








# CREAM PUFFS WITH LEMON CREAM AND STRAWBERRIES...

# Yum Yum!



sident...**Sue Larson**  Cream puff: 1 cup water, 1/2 cup butter, 1 cup flour, 1/4-1/2 tsp salt, 4 eggs

Heat oven 425. Heat water and butter to a rolling boil. Stir in flour. Stir vigorously over low heat about 1 minute or until mixture forms a ball. Remove from heat. Beat eggs one at a time beating until smooth. Drop dough by 1/4 cupful X 3" apart onto ungreased baking sheet. Bake 30–35 minutes or until puffed and golden brown. Let cool away from any draft.

#### **Lemon Cream Filling**

- $1/2 \mathrm{~cup~sugar}$
- 1 large egg
- 1/4 cup fresh lemon juice
- 11/2 teaspoons finely grated lemon peel
- · Pinch of salt
- 3 tablespoons unsalted butter, diced
- · 1 cup chilled heavy whipping cream


Combine sugar, egg, lemon juice, lemon peel, and a pinch of salt in heavy small saucepan...whisk to blend. Add butter. Stir constantly over medium-low heat until curd is hot and thick enough to coat the spoon (do not boil), 4 to 5 minutes. Transfer lemon curd to a medium bowl and cool. Using an electric mixer, beat cream in another medium bowl until peaks form. Fold whipped cream into curd in 3 additions. Cover and chill filling 1 hour. DO AHEAD: Can be made 2 hours ahead. Keep chilled.

Cut top off cream puffs. Fill cream puffs with lemon cream filling. Top with sliced strawberries



and sprinkle with powdered sugar and drizzle with white chocolate.

Sometimes, life just happens and before you know it, it's been three and a half years since you were married and you still haven't taken your official honeymoon! We knew we wanted to go somewhere warm, tropical, and a place neither of us had ever visited. This trip was made even extra special as this would also be our kick off to start trying for children. Any place with known cases of Zika Virus was off the list! Fiji and the Maldives were out and the one bucket-list safe place to go was the French Polynesian Island of Bora Bora. After much research, we were excited to begin planning our much-awaited honeymoon to Bora Bora!

There were only three resorts that stood out to us: the St. Regis, Four Seasons, and Conrad Bora Bora Nui. After consulting with friends, family and online forums we chose The St. Regis Bora Bora. This was a GREAT choice! This resort has a great spa and the most amazing private Lagoonarium which is a protected underwater sanctuary on-site to snorkel in. Their overwater villas boast over 1,500 square feet, with glass viewing panels, and the amazing St. Regis Butler service. We made reservations for the nine nights we were there at least a few weeks prior to arrival due to the St. Regis' popularity. Patrons from other resorts boat over to the St. Regis for their variety of high



















caliber restaurants. We would recommend flying from SFO to Tahiti verses flying from Sacramento to Los Angeles and then on to Tahiti. This flight option of SFO to Tahiti was not available when we took our trip, ironically it became available the week we came home from Bora Bora.

We upgraded our villa to a Deluxe Mountain View room which was definitely worth it. We were greeted by friendly staff every morning with our Frenchpressed coffee and hot chocolate (my husband doesn't drink coffee!) as we took in the breathtaking views of Mt. Otemanu and crystal clear waters from our covered over-water patio. It was charming and necessary to have bicycles available as a means to get around this spacious resort. The more secluded villas are a brisk eight-minute bike ride to the spa and gym. We learned to leave a towel in the basket of our bikes in the common areas in order to have them waiting for us upon our return. Empty baskets symbolized "free to take." We stored ours on our front porch of our villa at night.

TripAdvisor reviews gave us one of the best tips of all: to pack pool floats and a tether for our swimming deck. The current under the villas is surprisingly strong and without the tether, we would have floated away, probably all the way to the next resort













over. We took a daily dip in the ocean from our decks and lounged in our pool floats with drinks in hand watching the fish swimming around us. It was probably one of our favorite pastimes of the trip. They sell fish food at the store at the St. Regis. HIGHLY recommend buying this food as it allows you to create quite the fish frenzy around your overwater swim deck! With the water being so warm and clear, we really enjoyed being able to snorkel right from our deck around our villa. We chose to bring our own snorkel masks, although masks and fins are available free of charge for a loan from the beach area of the St. Regis.

The only time we left the resort was for an all-day excursion to jet-ski around the island, snorkel the coral reef, and feed the sharks and sting-rays. A worthwhile experience you will never forget. We quickly learned that the St. Regis and the Four Seasons are the furthest from the excursion sites so the boat ride is a bit long. It was a good choice to make it an all-day trip instead of breaking the jet-ski tour and snorkel/shark feeding into two halfday excursions. While the day was long and we were exhausted by the time we got back to the resort, we agreed two boat rides would have been a waste of valuable relaxation time at our resort. This how we also learned that the Conrad is close to the excursion sites and has a lot more boat traffic right in front of their villas, not as peaceful and windier at that end of the island.

The last five nights of our trip we upgraded our room to the Overwater Royal Otemanu Two-Bedroom Villa with our own swimming pool. While we didn't need two bedrooms or the 3,500 square feet, it was the only way to have your own private plunge pool on our deck. It was worth it! If you are looking for seclusion and quality time with your loved one, this is it! We only left for breakfast and dinner once we moved to the Royal Villa. We didn't have a desire to go to the resort pools when we could enjoy our cocktails from our private pool while overlooking the ocean and listening to our own music on our portable Bose speaker.

The service at St. Regis is unmatched. Our Butler Maricela was incredible and we highly recommend her! Bora Bora is a magical place. We've never seen waters so clear or had better snorkeling than on our trip there. There is something to be said about having your own overwater villa, which is what makes it stand out from any Hawaiian Island. The distance and time spent traveling are definitely long, but without question worth it for this once-in-a-lifetime destination!







The other day, a neighbor asked me for my opinion on email services, and I was a bit hesitant to make a recommendation. Why? Because I know of no email service that would ultimately make you feel secure while providing their service for free.

In the USA, most email services, provided by vendors like Google (Gmail), Microsoft (Hotmail.com, Outlook.com) or Oath (the new division of Verizon that owns AOL and Yahoo) are provided for free. By comparison, most email services provided outside of the U.S. cost some amount of money.

Why do we get free email service?

The answer might surprise you: because we give those companies the permission to store, read, analyze, and share our email and attachments with others. Wait! Isn't that illegal? Nope - this is the Internet, not the U.S. Post Office rules at play here.

One of the most concerning issues in email today is privacy since most companies that provide free services make money by using or selling your data in some way. Most of us would immediately point the finger at Google's Gmail. which I believe was the first service to admit it was reading our email, but since then has cleaned up its act significantly. It has installed anti-phishing protections, anti-brute-force password protections, and anti-eavesdropping measures to prevent criminals from reading your email as you send or receive it. Most interestingly, we all knew Gmail scanned its messages for ad targeting, but it stopped the practice in June of last year.

Microsoft has several email offers and

has consolidated the long-standing Hotmail.com service into its Outlook. com offer. If you hate spam, Outlook. com has some of the best spam filterings I've seen so far and prevents many obnoxious messages from ever hitting your inbox, unless you specifically select the "junk mail" folder. I attempted to review their specific privacy policy and was unable to find data specific to email scanning for purposes other than spam identification, which Microsoft admits to. While Microsoft has adopted several practices that I don't like from a security standpoint, like storing and analyzing all of your Bing searches, it's unclear if it now does this in email as well.

AOL and Yahoo are some of the oldest names in email and are now part of Oath, a Verizon company. I'm most troubled by their updated privacy policy, which notes that it has the right to read your emails, instant messages,

posts, photos and even look at your message attachments. And it might share that data with parent company Verizon, too. Reading further about what it might do with your words, photos, and attachments, the company says that it's utilizing automated systems that help the company with security, research and providing targeted ads — and that those automated systems should strip out personally identifying information before letting any humans look at your data. But there are no specific guarantees. Also pointed out recently, emails including details of your banking and financial transactions are also scanned by Oath's ad targeting engine.

So, which is best? It's more difficult than ever to know, but my recommendations are (in order of preference): Gmail, Outlook, Yahoo, AOL. I recommend Gmail because of all the work Google has done to protect you in the ways that matter, and the fact that they've stopped reading email for ad targeting. The others have been less forthcoming, or in the case of Oath, seeming to care more about monetizing your data than protecting it. By the way, I didn't include Apple in the mix this time around but will look at it the next time I delve into the topic.

A final thought — I want to warn you against using only one company to provide all your online computing needs, and this applies to Google, Microsoft, Yahoo, Apple, and any other giant service provider. If you were to have your email hacked or blocked, you don't want to lose access to your photos, documents, music storage, blog, social network, digital wallet etc. at the same time. Using different companies for different services is more important than before since it helps protect your privacy as well.

It was a fabulous day where new friends and memories were made. Thank you to Lesleigh Root for organizing this fun event!


















