It felt like a great way to return the same kindness he put into greeting us all. Painting him and his dogs up on that wall made it feel like Wally was an official part of our school spirit.

We are all really glad that his story took off in the news. A lot of big networks decided to cover him: ABC, CBS and Inside Edition. Personally, I am glad that our mural helped in some way to feature his incredible personality. We posed for a picture with him for Village Life before we left Marina, and it was really surprising to hear, in the middle of freshman year, that the Washington Post

So, when my eighth grade history teacher assigned a community service project, the girls and I jumped at the opportunity. 



Instructions

- 1. Turn slow cooker to high
- 2. Pour turkey into slow cooker and stir in 2 packages of taco
- Take out tomatoes out of can, place tomatoes off to the side and pour the tomato sauce into slow cooker
- Cut the whole tomatoes into three pieces and stir into slow cooker
- 5. Pour black, kidney, pinto beans
- 6. Pour whole kernel corn and stir into slow cooker
- 7. Cut Serrano peppers (For mild, separate seeds. Add into

- 9. Put the lid and leave it cooking for 5 hours



What the HECK is a VPN?

If you spend time on the Internet, you may have seen the term "VPN." This month I want to share what a VPN is, what it does, and why it is used. VPN stands for "Virtual Private Network," and is a method for securing the communications between your computer and an Internet website, giving you a private connection no one else can eavesdrop on. It's software you can install on your computer or that a company automatically uses on their website so you don't need one. It secures your communications by taking the data coming from your computer and scrambling it before it is transmitted over the Internet to the receiving website or server, and vice-versa. The VPN uses a "key," a special numeric code that is known only by the sending and receiving computer to descramble the data once it is received. No one else knows that key, so your data travel without risk of others seeing it.

All large businesses use a VPN in their data center to automatically provide this additional level of security for all of their communications, to ensure that no one can "listen in" on the company's business. For example, your bank uses a VPN whenever you are using their website to review your account data, pay bills, transfer

money, etc. The VPN ensures that no hacker sees your personal information, your accounts, balances or the instructions you're giving the bank to pay your water bill. In this case, the bank's VPN is scrambling your data as you send it to them, and your computer is unscrambling the data sent back, so you can see it correctly, but no one else can. It's becoming more and more popular for websites to provide this VPN function when you connect to their website. But not every site does.

Most consumers don't use VPNs -- because they're not aware that personal VPNs are available. They don't know what they do, or don't see the value. Do you ever use your laptop computer in a public place like a coffee shop, an airport, or on an airplane in flight? In each of these situations, there is an 'open' (unsecured) Wi-Fi network available in the location for you to use, as well as everyone else. Many assume that their communications in these situations are kept private, but that is not usually the case unless the websites they access provide the VPN function. Using the coffee shop example, if you are sending messages to friends using an unprotected program or website, others in the shop might be able to see what you are doing.

How? Computer professionals have access to a set of tools usually used to monitor and fix problems on Wi-Fi connections, but these tools can also be used by hackers. As an example, once while on a plane to the east coast, I was able to use a tool on my PC to see the computer names of everyone else on the flight that connected to the plane's Wi-Fi, and if I chose to, I might even have been able see what they were doing. Scary, right?

You need a VPN when sending sensitive data over the Internet to a person or website that is not already providing the VPN function. You don't need a VPN if you are in a coffee shop and using your PC to read news, surf the web, watch a video, or other things that are general in nature. You can tell if the website you're connecting to provides the VPN function (also called encryption) if you see the letters "HTTPS:" (not HTTP:) in the web address field at the top of your browser. For example, connect to Wells-Fargo.com, and your browser shows https://wellsfargo.com. That additional "S" shows you're protected.
