Now I see my life And shake my head in disbelief This courageous painful journey Held the key to finding me





Steak Oscar for TWO...

Is Your Mouth Watering?

resident recipe...

Steak Oscar for Two

Ingredients: For the Steak:

- · 2 Filet Mignon Steaks
- · 1 tablespoon Himalayan salt
- · 3 tablespoons fresh cracked black pepper
- · 2 tablespoons avocado oil

For the Hollandaise:

- 2 egg yolks
- · 1 stick butter
- · Juice of 1 lemon
- · Salt and pepper to taste
- · Dash of fresh tarragon minced

For the Crab Cakes:

- 1 Dungeness crab, shelled and cartilage removed
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice





- 1 egg
- · 1 teaspoon Himalayan salt
- 1 ½ teaspoon cracked black pepper
- · 1 tablespoon fresh parsley, finely minced
- ½ cup fresh grated Parmesan cheese
- ½ teaspoon Old Bay Seasoning
- · 1 teaspoon avocado oil

For the Shrimp:

- · 4 Extra Large Shrimp, peeled, deveined, with tails attached
- 1 teaspoon Himalayan salt
- 1 ½ teaspoon black pepper
- · 1 teaspoon smoked paprika
- · 1 teaspoon avocado oil

For Asparagus:

- · 1 pound fresh asparagus
- 1/4 cup unsalted butter
- · Salt and pepper to taste

First things first, preheat oven to 500 with a large cast-iron skillet in the oven. Trust me on this one...your filet will cook to a perfect medium rare every time! While your pan is pre-heating in the oven, you're going to prep the rest of your ingredients. As well as preheating the oven, you're going to preheat a small saucepan and fill it halfway with water and turn on medium heat because you want the water boiling by the time it's time to whip together that beautiful Hollandaise sauce.

First, the crab cakes. The crab cakes are so simple. I usually just crack the crab meat into one bowl and then I do a quick once over with my hands and make sure I didn't miss any pieces of shell or cartilage 'cause let's face it, no one wants to sink their teeth into a hard piece of shell. In the same bowl, add your egg, Parmesan, lemon, salt, pepper and parsley. Now gently mix the ingredients together with a fork until the egg and Parmesan have blended together well. If your crab mixture seems too wet, add another 1/4 cup of Parmesan cheese. Scoop two heaping spoonfuls of the

crab mixture into your hand and gently form a patty in between your two hands. Next, we're going to cook this crabby goodness. In a skillet over medium heat, heat the avocado oil and place each crab cake until golden brown on each side, about five minutes each. Set crab cakes aside.

Next is the shrimp in the same pan you cooked the crab cakes in. If you need more oil, add the additional avocado oil, if not, go ahead and omit. Crank that heat up to medium-high heat. Lightly toss the shrimp with the paprika, salt and pepper in a small bowl. Grill shrimp on both sides until browned on both sides, about three minutes on both sides.

Your next step is that glorious meat. Freshly crack the salt and pepper directly onto a wood cutting board and gently roll the meat on all sides into the seasonings so your meat picks up the seasonings on all sides. Do this with both pieces of Filet Mignon. Let it sit for 10 minutes so it can soak in those seasonings. While the meat is soaking, carefully remove your large cast-iron out of the oven and you're going to put it on the stove and turn the stove on HIGH heat. You want the pan to be at 500-degree heat on the stove as well. Lightly oil your pan with avocado oil and place the filets directly into the pan. Do not walk away. You're going to want to time this closely at 1 minute and 30 seconds on the first side. Flip that meat and cook for another 1 minute and 30 seconds on the other side. Flip again. Place in the oven. Time for 45 seconds and flip your meat one more time and time for 45 seconds. Remove your meat from oven and remove from pan to rest for 10 minutes on a plate or cutting board.


While your meat is resting you're going to cook your asparagus and Hollandaise. In a large skillet, melt butter and place your asparagus in a pan over medium-high heat. The asparagus should take just about as long as the Hollandaise takes to whip up.

Last but not least, the buttery richness of that beautiful Hollandaise. This is where you get an arm workout while you're cooking. In a metal bowl, place your two egg yolks. Next, using a whisk, you're going to whip those eggs for 30 seconds above the pan with the water, 30 seconds off the pan, 30 seconds above, 30 seconds off. You will see your eggs will start to turn a rich golden yellow color and start to thicken. This is when you add a little bit of the butter and continue to whip 30 seconds on and 30 seconds off, add more butter and continue the 30 seconds on/off method until you've added all of the butter, then finish off with the lemon, salt, pepper and fresh tarragon.

For the assembly, place the filet on the plate first. Place five asparagus spears to the left of the filet. Next drizzle the Hollandaise over the filet, top with crab cake, finish by crisscrossing the shrimp on top of the Hollandaise and I lightly stick a piece of parsley in between the two pieces of shrimp for garnish. Next, serve to your loved ones and watch them enjoy this lovely meal.

Who is your role model/Who do you look up to? Rob Pannell, who is a professional lacrosse player.


Now that you're a senior, looking back, what was the best memory of high school? I don't have one memory in particular, but competing every day with my friends is something I'll look back on later in life.

On an expedition cruise to the Galapagos a few years ago Michael and I met a couple in their 80s. They told us they had recently completed their fifth and final trip to Antarctica. What? I did not know what was more shocking to me; the idea of traveling to Antarctica, going there five times or doing it in your 80s! Michael and I are adventurous and have wandered around six continents. But a trip to the seventh? Antarctica never crossed our minds until listening to what this older couple had to say.

We returned home and began our research. We learned the journey is fraught with potential problems. First, there is no guarantee that you will get there due to the volatility of the weather and there are NO refunds regardless of whether you ever step foot on Antarctica. You must book far in advance as the ships have very limited crossings and they must be done in the Antarctic summer (our winter). You are required to sign a detailed liability waiver because if you do have an emergency, critical evacuation may not be possible. And, finally, this journey is not inexpensive.

We learned that there are many cruise lines that will sail by Antarctica, but we wanted a "boots on the ground" experience on an ice-breaker expedition ship. We chose an itinerary that would give us six days of active exploration, weather permitting. We invited our Serrano friends, Stan and Karen Huser, to join us, and they were all in!

But I was quite nervous. To get to Antarctica you must cross the roughest stretch of water in the world, the Drake Passage, which is the body of water between the southernmost point of South America (Cape Horn) and Antarctica. The Drake Passage is where the Atlantic meets the Pacific, tropical water meets frigid water, and this collision of waters can cause tremendous turmoil. The weather is extreme and hard to predict. Waves can range from gentle swells to 40 feet high! The Passage is 600 miles wide and takes about two days to cross in either direction, and we would have to do it twice! Conditions at the crossing are a coin toss. Either we could have "Drake's Lake" and have smoother waters, or we could have the dreaded "Drake's Shake."



Crossing Drake Passage is the price of entry for going to the Antarctic from South America. Even Charles Darwin, who made comprehensive studies of the flora, fauna and topography of these regions aboard the HMS Beagle in the mid-1800s, was famously seasick while rounding Cape Horn. But our ship was prepared to meet these challenges with an internal stabilization system and an ice-strengthened hull and was under the command of a seasoned captain and experienced crew with thousands of hours at sea. Regardless of the weather, we knew that we would be safe. We ended up lucky, and both of our crossings were more lake than a shake. There was some rocking and rolling but thankfully nothing too crazy!

The morning our ship arrived we threw back the curtains in our room and looked out. We were here! The adrenaline and sheer euphoria of that moment is something we will never forget. How to explain the wonder of Antarctica? How do you describe the serenity you feel gazing upon such beauty, purity and magnificence? How do you describe seeing the most pristine and peaceful scenery you are ever likely to experience? How do you describe the moment a pod of humpback whales gently circles your small zodiac boat and you feel no fear because you are so happy? How do you describe 100 different shades of white?

This euphoria kept growing with our first iceberg sightings, first whale sightings and first seal sightings. We kayaked past small icebergs, through slushy waters while dodging ice chunks in search of wildlife, and it was absolutely thrilling! And the penguins...oh my gosh! They will steal your heart. They are curious and funny with loads of personality. They do not fear humans and are very social. Every man and woman quickly fell in love with these happy little guys!

The 450 people on that ship were communally stunned by our Antarctic experience, and passengers and crew alike celebrated and shared in the mutual joy of what we had been graced to see. Someone once wrote so beautifully that Antarctica is a community. Each moment is made up of hundreds of moments seen and lived through hundreds of eyes. In those six days, it was impossible not to have been changed in some way. It changes your perspective of life. It changes your awareness and knowledge of the environment. But most importantly, you have changed. You go home a new person, a better person. It is impossible not to be moved by the sheer beauty and power of this exquisite and brutal continent.

For me, Antarctica is like a secret piece of heaven at the bottom of the earth. If you are looking for the adventure of your life, to be thrilled at times beyond measure, and if you want to bask in phenomenal beauty in a place that very few people will ever see, consider Antarctica.

Michael and I have already booked our return trip to Antarctica. But this time we are staying even longer!

Q&A

How cold was it? It was summertime and daytime temperatures were in the low 30s. But that does not take wind chill into account when it starts to blow! Antarctica is bigger than Europe or Australia and it is 98% ice. Antarctica is a desert and is the coldest and windiest place on earth. Ice goes as deep as three miles and is as old as 3 million years. When the wind blows over that icy continent it is quite cold!

Is Antarctica the South Pole? No. Antarctica is the continent surrounding the South Pole. The South Pole is the southern end of the axis on which our planet rotates. The South Pole is located under the glacier that covers Antarctica.

Are there polar bears? No. Polar bears live in the Arctic (the North Pole) while penguins live in Antarctica (the South Pole).

Who owns Antarctica? No country owns it. It is an environmental preserve for scientific research, overseen by 50 countries. It is the most protected place on the planet, especially from tourists.




"My dog is blind." Words I thought I would never be saying about my middle-aged Dachshund. "Don't worry, he's blind, he can't see what's happening," are my regular friendly reassurances to many who look at my dog in confusion when he's either facing in the opposite direction of them, looking at a wall, or tilting his head to the side while staring at the ground. My dog, who is a short haired black and tan dachshund named Chayce (pronounced Chase), turned 10 years old this year. He gradually became blind at the age of 6.

I received Chayce when he was a puppy and, over time, he grew into a handsome, healthy Dachshund. However, in 2015 I began noticing changes in his behavior when he showed reluctance to climb down our staircase. This was followed by walking into our sliding glass door and eventually missing his food bowls. Concerned, I took him to the vet, and when his eyes were examined we learned he had SARDS (Sudden Acquired Retinal Degeneration Syndrome). Dachshunds are among a few breeds commonly affected by this disease, and there is no known cause or cure for it. My 6-year-old Dachshund was becoming blind at a rapid pace, and there was nothing I could do to stop it.

I won't pretend it was easy, but we acclimated to the change. I've had to become mindful of Chayce wherever he's at, exactly like keeping an eye on my son. There have been a few times when Chayce has wandered straight out of the front door, and I've had to run after him. I now use certain commands that he recognizes, especially if he's heading towards an obstacle. I've even learned how to hold his leash in a particular way to better direct him

while we're walking outside. In addition, whenever we're around a pool, I have to keep him on a leash so he will not fall in.

Throughout these changes, I've noticed a new personality emerge in Chayce. He's become friendlier and more patient with the people around him in addition to becoming closer to our family and friends. He continues to live a full life as we've adjusted to this new normal. Although Chayce was not born with this condition, he has a resilience that allows him to keep moving forward, which is something we can all learn from, and that is one of his many endearing qualities. He is a well-loved member of our family, and I wouldn't have it any other way.

A few months ago, in our December 2018 issue, we investigated some popular web-based email products like Gmail, Outlook, Yahoo and AOL. I wrote why many Internet-based email products are free to use, and it's because, with many (most) free online products, *you're the product*, not the *customer*, since in the terms of service (that long document full of boring legalese you have to click to approve) you allow the online companies the right to read your emails, instant messages, posts, photos and even scan your message attachments.

Time and space did not allow me to include Apple Mail in the article, so I've done my research, and will discuss that here.

I've never personally used Apple Mail, although I now carry an iPhone, and use an iPad and Mac computers on occasion. Based on the public and non-public information I was able to review, Apple has a pretty good track record of keeping customer email activities private. In recent years, researchers have found flaws in the HTML rendering of Apple Mail on Mac and iOS, as well as Mozilla Thunderbird, that allowed attackers to extract decrypted plain text from encrypted mail messages. While many email programs do not encrypt (scramble) text in emails, Apple and others provide that when required.

The big question I wanted to answer: Is Apple accessing your private email, attachments, etc. for the purposes of monetizing (selling to third-party data brokers) your data? Thankfully, it appears not.

While Apple does have examples of data breaches, where due to bugs in internal software, customer data and activities can be accessed by the public, or specifically by hackers, Apple has been relatively quick to correct the flaws in question, with the most recent one I found being fixed in November. That bug possibly allowed hackers to access or corrupt Apple's iCloud contact data but does not appear to have relevance for the email security topic.

So, short and sweet, if you're using, or thinking of using Apple Mail, you're in good hands.

Another thing that I want to share is the increasing use of telephone calls by scammers to the public to try and get data or money from us. The scenario is you get a call on your mobile or house phone where the caller claims to be from Apple (or Microsoft, Google or the IRS). They will claim any number of things, including that you've not paid your bill or taxes, that they have found inappropriate data in your email or web browsing, or that they have noticed a security breach on your PC or Mac computer. For a fee, they will fix the problem for you. Please immediately hang up on these callers and don't give them ANY information, including your name, address, etc. The IRS and these companies simply do not call customers for these sorts of things, so don't fall prey to these (increasing) scams.



Court-Appointed Special Advocates of El Dorado County (CASA) supports abused, neglected, and at-risk youth in court by providing volunteers who voice the child's best interest. They asked The Giving Circle for funds to help expand the team of Court Appointed Special Advocates and train these new volunteers, who in turn will serve 15 foster youth in the El Dorado Hills community. With the help of the advocates, these children will be less likely to remain in foster care long term and have a better chance of continuing their education. For the community as a whole, this results in less cost and strain on the juvenile court and child protection systems and provides for a more stable social environment for all.

Hands4Hope - Youth Making a Difference is a youth-

led service-learning and outreach organization dedicated to inspiring and empowering youth in leadership and service. They asked for funds to help them develop and nurture young leaders in our community into socially responsible, civic-minded residents who have compassion for those in need; who engage in action to bring about change; and who work for a safe, vital community. The program has seen students go from quiet and shy, to leading a club of 35 and speaking to community leaders. A student with autism found acceptance and friendship within the H4H Club, then became club treasurer. Youth get involved, find their passion, build confidence and skills, and inspire and lead their peers in service projects that positively impact the lives of hundreds of local residents annually.

The Assistance League of the Sierra Foothills volunteers transform the lives of children and adults through community programs and asked for funds to support Operation School Bell, which allows disadvantaged students to feel better about their lives by providing an opportunity





pate more in school both academically and socially.




